#### **SCOPE OF POSITION**

This is the highest level of profession Medical Technologist. He/She is responsible to the Director of National Laboratory Services for the adequacy and efficiency of the Service under his or her responsibility.

•	Technical Staff Administration	Support the directorate in technical staff recruitment and deployment.
•	Training	Coordination of training programmes of Medical Technologists (including Practicums), Technical Assistants, Medical Technicians and other similar level technical staff.
•	Emergency Laboratory	Under the overall direction of the Haematology Unit, he /she is responsible for optimum functioning and Coordination of Emergency Laboratory Services at Kingston Public Hospital.
•	Laboratory Safety	Under the specific direction of the Director and in Consultation with the Quality Coordinator, develop and maintain optimal Laboratory Safety System.
•	Specimen Quality	Optimize appropriate specimen collection and maintaining specimen quality.
